Staffing Changes - Goodbye to Mrs Hancox and Mr Lord

We will be saying goodbye to two members of staff at Christmas who are moving on to new schools in the new year.

Goodbye and thank you to Mrs Hancox

We are very sad to be saying goodbye to Mrs Hancox at Christmas. Mrs Hancox has been at St Joseph's for the last 8 years and has been an excellent teacher. During this time she has taught in Year 1, Reception and Year 2. In recent years she has been the Head of Early Years and our Acting Assistant Headteacher. Most recently, following the birth of her daughter, Mrs Hancox returned to St Joseph's on a part time basis.



Mrs Hancox has responded to a genuine call from another Catholic school in the Archdiocese who are in need of her support. Unusually, but given the fact we want to support our fellow Catholic schools, we have agreed to release Mrs Hancox early so that she can go and help her new school who are without an Early Years Leader.

We are very lucky to have a full staff of good teachers at St Joseph's and Miss Wisniewski will take over as the Early Years Lead Teacher.

At the same time we have to remember that many Catholic schools struggle to recruit good quality Catholic teachers and we could easily be in this situation ourselves one day – if that ever happens I hope another Catholic school would be as accommodating as we have in letting a teacher leave at short notice in order to assist us.

Mrs Hancox has been an excellent and dedicated Catholic teacher at this school. She will be very much missed and we are very grateful for everything she has added to our school over the years. Mrs Hancox has made a significant contribution to St Joseph's and we are truly grateful for her commitment. She will be an asset to her new school.

Cover Teacher for Reception and Nursery Classes (half a day in each class per week) – Mrs Marley


