

## Photography and Filming Consent Form

In order to demonstrate your child's achievements and celebrate the life of the school, we take photographs and videos as they work and play. Under the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) we must ask you for your consent and offer you an easy means to withdraw your consent on behalf of your child at any time.

We must also notify you of the school's general Privacy Statement that is available on each of the school's websites in which we state our policy to erase all documents and photographs relating to your child in line with the academy document retention policy.

We ask you as a parent or carer to decide on behalf of your child what can be done with their images and the permission or withdrawal you give will last the entire duration your child is with us unless you notify us otherwise.

My child can be photographed and filmed for these purposes (please  $\checkmark$  tick every box you agree to). Absence of a tick means that I do not wish my child's image to be used for that activity.

I have understood the above statements and have agreed to the photo and film uses I have ticked. I also understand that I can withdraw consent by completing and returning a *Consent Withdrawal or Alteration* form which is available from the school's website or from the school office. This will be acted on within 5 working days of term time:

## Conditions of use:

We will not re-use any photographs or recordings outside of our document retention policy.

Historic photographs will remain on our school website and social media feeds.

We will not use the personal details or full names (which means first name and surname) of any child or adult in a photographic image or video, on our website, on our social media platforms in our school prospectus or in any of our other printed publications. If we use photographs of individual pupils, we will not use the name of that child in the accompanying text or photo caption.

If we name a pupil in the text, we will not use an individual photograph of that child to accompany the article.

We may include pictures of pupils and teachers that have been drawn by the pupils.

We may use group or class photographs or footage with very general labels, such as 'a science lesson' or 'making Christmas decorations'
