P.E. will be on Mondays and Wednesdays. Please could you ensure that your child brings their P.E. kit which is black shorts, a white T- shirt and pumps or trainers.

Homework will be given out on a Friday which will be due back in on the following Wednesday. The weekly spelling test will be on a Monday.
