In Autumn and Spring term parents are given the option to attend a parents' evening and receive a mini-report and in the Summer term there is a full written report provided to parents and the opportunity to discuss this at a parents' evening too. Teachers will always do their best to speak to you the same day, but please note they can't always speak / see you immediately during the school day as they are teaching and would never be able to leave children unattended. Class Trips

Once again, thank you for completing the questionnaire last term regarding trip payments. We will soon have the information to share with parents regarding the costs of trips for the Spring and Summer Terms – this obviously varies from class to class as they are linked to the curriculum. We will soon add the option on Arbor to pay trips in full – for parents that wish to – and create a way that the overall cost of trips can be paid in a monthly way, providing parents with more flexibility. We plan to schedule any monthly payments from February (January is always a difficult month after Christmas!) to June 2026. I hope this enable us to keep the lovely trips we have to support the curriculum and provide lovely experiences for our children.

Nut-Free School

St Joseph's is a nut-free school. The reason for this is due to the growing number of children with mild to very severe nut allergies. We have to insist that children do not bring any items of food into school that contain nuts. We wouldn't want any child / family to feel responsible endangering another child. Please note that Nutella and some chocolate spreads contain nuts. Please be vigilant and support us to keep all of our children safe and well. Thank you for your support.



Please support us in maintaining our high uniform standards

Please ensure that children come to school in the correct uniform. Earrings (even covered with plasters), trainers, hair shavings and leggings with skirts are **not allowed**. Please see the uniform guide below taken from our school website.

Trainers, boots or fashion shoes are not allowed.

Hair Styles and Nail Varnish

Hair shaving and sculpting (e.g. tram lines, ticks, and other shavings) are not allowed. Hairstyles must be smart and neat. Use of gels or styling products should be minimal. For safety reasons all long hair (boys and girls) must be tied back at all times. Highlights, dyeing and colouring of hair is not allowed.



Nail varnish is not allowed.

Jewellery


As a safety precaution and to prevent accidents during PE and other activities, the wearing of any item of jewellery in Nursery or Main School is strictly forbidden without exception. Children are allowed to wear a wrist watch however this can not be a smart watch for safeguarding reasons.

Attendance and Punctuality

Any one of us can be running late from time to time for good reasons – but children must ordinarily arrive at school at the correct start time – and as per school registration rules – they will be marked late if they arrive after the start time. We reserve the right to unauthorise persistent lateness and this will be recorded as unauthorised absence which can ultimately lead to intervention from the Education Investigation Service and possible penalties. Please support regular attendance and regular good timekeeping. The Children's Commissioner has produced some excellent resources related to attendance which we will be sharing in school. One important point to note from the Children's Commissioner is that – **'if you miss 30 minutes of school a day this amounts to 19 days lost each year.'** Please could I ask parents to contact school if your child is absent. Increasingly, parents are not letting school know which becomes a safeguarding concern for us. If we can not contact parents, we then have to follow our safeguarding procedures which include a home visit and the possibility of contacting other agencies – all of which is very avoidable. Please let us know by phoning the school office or messaging through Arbor. Thank you for your support.

Events in school

Class teachers will also be letting you know dates for Parent Workshops where you have the opportunity to come into school and take part in a lesson with your child – the focus this term is Writing.
