<u>Values for Autumn Term:</u> <b>Curious and Active</b> — before half term <b>Curious:</b> Being curious means wanting to learn more about the world, asking questions, and wondering about God, people, and how things work. <b>Active:</b> Being active means getting involved, helping others, and using your gifts to make a positive difference at school, at home, and in the world.	<u>Children as leaders</u> Through the year, children will have opportunities to be leaders. We choose pupil leader groups at the beginning of the year. Children will be able to actively take part in assemblies, masses and prayer gathering through the year.
<b>Intentional and Prophetic</b> - after half term <b>Intentional:</b> Being intentional means trying to do the right thing on purpose, making good choices, and thinking about how your actions can show love and kindness. <b>Prophetic:</b> Being prophetic means standing up for what is right, speaking kindly but bravely, and showing God's love by caring for others, especially those who need help.	<u>St Joseph's Way</u> – See our website for more details At St. Joseph's we develop children's character through the 'St. Joseph's Way' curriculum. To build character, we define the behaviours and habits that we expect students to demonstrate. We want to support our pupils to grow into adults who are polite, respectful, grateful and who put others before themselves. We believe that, as pupils practise these behaviours over time, they become habits that positively shape how they feel about themselves and how other people perceive them. As philosopher Will Durant states, "We are what we repeatedly do. Excellence, then, is not an act, but a habit." (1926)
<u>Catholic Social Teaching &amp; British Values</u> Throughout the curriculum and beyond children learn about the 7 principles of Catholic Social Teaching - Working in Solidarity, Care for Creation, Community & Participation, Dignity of Workers, help for the Poor & Vulnerable, Human Dignity & Solidarity and how they link to British Values – Democracy, Rule of Law, Individual Liberty, Respect & Tolerance.
